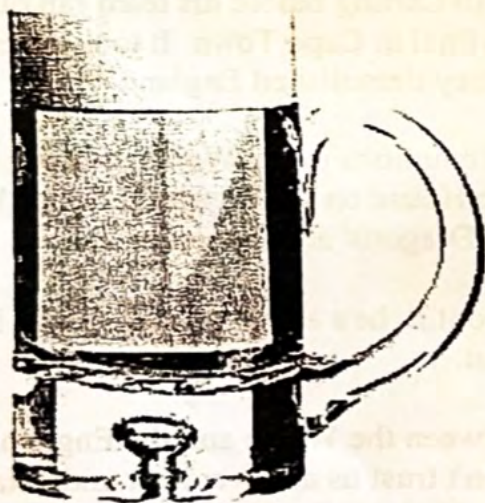
How To Perform The Haka

Planet Rugby brings you some classic quotes from the historical archives.

1. "Remember that rugby is a team game; all 14 of you make sure you pass the ball to Jonah." FAX to the All Blacks before the 1995 World Cup semi-final.
2. "I think Brian Moore's gnashers are the kind you get from a DIY shop and hammer in yourself. He is the only player we have who looks like a French forward." Former England prop Paul Rendall on his front row colleague.
3. "You've got to get your first tackle in early, even if it's late." Welsh hardman Ray Gravell explains his rugby philosophy.
4. "I played ten injury-free years between the ages of 12 and 22. Then, suddenly, it seemed like I was allergic to the twentieth century." Former England scrum-half Nigel Melville who spent most of the 1980s injured.
5. "We're going to tear those boys apart." Message pinned up on the changing room wall by England skipper Will Carling before his team ran out to face the All Blacks in the 1995 World Cup semi-final in Cape Town. It took at least 70 seconds for New Zealand to score their first try as they demolished England 45-29.
6. "Don't ask me about emotions in the Welsh dressing room. I'm someone who cries when he watches 'Little House on the Prairie'" Former Welsh second row Bob Norster remembers that special Dragons' atmosphere.
7. "There's no doubt about it, he's a big bastard" Gavin Hastings, master of the bleedin' obvious, on Jonah Lomu.
8. "The relationship between the Welsh and the English is based on trust and understanding. They don't trust us and we don't understand them." Former RFU supremo Dudley Wood on Anglo-Welsh relations.
9. "If you can't take a punch, you should play table tennis." Former French skipper and coach Pierre Berbizier illustrates his nation's attitude to on-pitch violence.
10. "A player of ours has been proven guilty of biting. That's a scar that will never heal." Bath coach Andy Robinson after his prop Kevin Yates was suspended for taking a chunk out of an opposing flanker's ear.

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The 4th Annual Youth and High School “Skills, Drills, and Thrills” Camp

Marquette University and the Wisconsin Rugby Union will be hosting the 4th Annual “Skills, Drills and Thrills” youth and high school camp in Milwaukee, Wisconsin on Thursday and Friday, July 21st and 22nd, 2005. All participants will be entered to play in the High School Division of the 9th Annual Marquette Mid-Summer Sevens on Saturday, July 23rd.

Last year the camp had 156 male and female participants from Wisconsin, Minnesota and Illinois. The players were given instruction in rugby basics, conditioning, advanced skills and theory, and individual skills sessions where players worked one on one with a position coach. The camp had 26 coaches in attendance from over a dozen clubs.

The camp teaches/refreshes fundamental skills as well as advanced skills such as kicking for position, decision making and playing to a defense. The camp concludes with a crash course on the game of seven-a-side rugby. Players will be housed at Marquette University dormitories and are supervised from Thursday morning until the end of their games Saturday afternoon.

The cost of the camp will include the camp, dormitory stay, Thursday and Friday lunch and Dinner, Saturday breakfast and entry to the Marquette Mid-Summer Sevens tourney on Saturday. The camp also provides each participant with their own rugby ball which is theirs to keep at the end of the weekend.

The cost of the camp will be \$ \$180 dollars per person includes lodging and most meals. Groups of ten or more will receive a discount The camp has its own e-group for up-to-date information. As participants register, they will be included on the Marquette Camp e-group.

Lastly, like all camps, volunteers are needed to make the camp a success. You cannot have too many coaches for such an event. Volunteers will be treated to lunch and a coach’s social Friday evening.
